Studies show that reading for pleasure makes a big difference to children's educational performance. Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures.</p> <p>Sharing a book with your child allows you to share adventures and experiences in the safe world of the book. It allows you to ask questions, talk about what has happened and decide what you think together. You can use our canine helper question sheet to help with the types of questions to ask to further develop your child's understanding of what they've read.</p> <p>We expect children to read at least 3 times per week. Children receive reading awards for each 25 reads they complete at home. Please make sure a parent/carer signs the reading diary each time.</p>
	<p>We have registered a trial for Times Tables Rock Stars. Please encourage your child to learn and practise their times tables recall of facts. I will be asking for feedback after the trial to see if this is something that will benefit our children at Ankermoor.</p>
