<b>Reading</b> 	Record in your reading diary when you have read. Try and read 3-5 times per week. Please try to read to or discuss your reading with an adult. <b>Adults</b> - please use the Canine questions that will be in the home / school diary. We are focusing on a canine each week to check your child's understanding about what they have read. It is important that children read for pleasure but also that they understand what they are reading.	5-10 minutes per session	<b>House points and reading challenge rewards.</b>	
<b>Grammar and Spelling</b> 	Look at the <b>Statutory Spellings / Common Exception</b> words sent home by your teacher - work on these at home. These will be re-tested each term. <b>Grammar bug units of work</b> linked to the grammar and spelling we are learning about will also be set each half term.	5-10 minutes per session (Once a week)	<b>House points given Spelling bee challenge</b>	
<b>Targeted Homework</b> 	All extra homework is targeted according to need so if your child has struggled in a particular area they will receive targeted strengthening homework for this. This will be recorded in your child's diary.	15 minutes depending on focus Maximum one piece a day.	<b>House points given</b>	
<b>Online extras</b> 	<b>TTRS / Numbots</b> is a great resource to practice basic skills in Maths. It is expected that you child knows <b>all times table and division facts to 12 x 12.</b>	5 minutes (3/4 times a week)	<b>House points given Weekly certificates</b>	
After October half term, SATs homework will be set for Year 6. This will include weekly practice tests in Reading, Maths and Grammar/Spelling.
