



Reading 	<p>Record in your reading diary when you have read. Try and read 3-5 times per week.</p> <p>Please try to read to or discuss your reading with an adult. Adults - please use the Canine questions that will be in the home / school diary. We are focusing on a canine each week to check your child's understanding about what they have read. It is important that children read for pleasure but also that they understand what they are reading.</p>	5-10 minutes per session	House points and reading challenge rewards.
Grammar and Spelling 	<p>Look at the Statutory Spellings / Common Exception words sent home by your teacher - work on these at home. These will be re-tested each term.</p> <p>Grammar bug units of work linked to the grammar and spelling we are learning about will also be set each half term.</p>	5-10 minutes per session (Once a week)	House points given Spelling bee challenge
Targeted Homework 	<p>All extra homework is targeted according to need so if your child has struggled in a particular area they will receive targeted strengthening homework for this. This will be recorded in your child's diary.</p>	15 minutes depending on focus Maximum one piece a day.	House points given
Online extras 	<p>TTRS / Numbots is a great resource to practice basic skills in Maths. It is expected that you child knows all times table and division facts to 12 x 12.</p>	5 minutes (3/4 times a week)	House points given Weekly certificates
SATs homework	<p>All pages within both <i>CGP</i> books should be completed before May 13th as this will help your child prepare for their SATS.</p>		House points given
